Bishop Checchio is initiating a parish consultation process to elicit your assessment of parish needs in regard to the appointment of a new pastor. Please see the article below for more details.

Pastors are appointed by the bishop to lead local parish communities and to provide for their pastoral care. They share in the bishop's ministry of teaching, sanctifying, and governing. With the bishop's mandate, and in cooperation with other priests and deacons in the parish as well as with the assistance of the laity, the pastor has full responsibility for the pastoral care of a local parish community.

To facilitate the appointment of a new pastor/administrator for St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish, Bishop Checchio has initiated a consultation process to elicit input from all parish leadership including clergy, staff, principals, and all parishioners, to determine what St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish needs in their new pastor. This consultation process includes two meetings; the first being with the parish clergy, parish staff, principal, and other parish employees, and a second general meeting with interested parishioners.

The meeting with parishioners will be held on **Monday, May 22nd beginning at 7:00 PM in the Parish Center Cafeteria**. This general meeting will be facilitated by Rev. Msgr. Edward C. Puleo, Executive Director, Dept. of Clergy & Religious Personnel and Very Rev. Brian Nolan, Dean of Somerset Hills Deanery, and will include our pastoral council, finance council, stewardship council, trustees, ministry leaders, and other parish leaders. All parishioners are invited to attend.

Through a guided listening session facilitated by Msgr. Puleo and Father Nolan, information will be gathered from parishioners that will assist the bishop in determining the parish needs. It must be clearly understood that this is a listening session only, and that the information on the needs of the parish gathered from parishioners is one factor among many which the bishop will consider in determining the next pastor of St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish. This meeting is not to solicit the names of individual priests and this will not be discussed. The Priest Personnel Board has the task of surfacing names of potential pastors to the Bishop.

All parishioners are asked to join in prayer for this process and any interested parishioners are invited and encouraged to attend this general meeting to help and share the needs of St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish.
